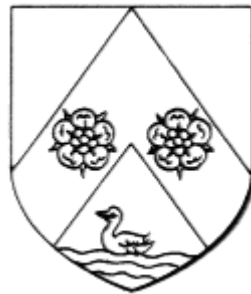


The Weydert Crest

Crest of the Weydert family originating from the Weyderthof (Weydert farm) near Larochette, Luxembourg.

Black and white version (Reference: "Armorial du pays de Luxembourg" by Dr Jean-Claude Loutsch, 1974):



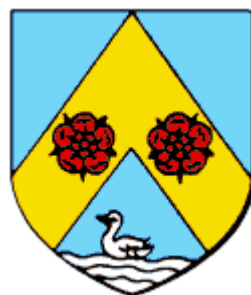
Heraldic description (in French):

D'azur au chevron d'or chargé de deux roses de gueules, accompagné en pointe d'une canette d'argent nageant dans une eau du même.

Free English translation:

Of azure with a chevron of gold charged with two red roses, accompanied at the base by a duck of silver swimming in a water of the same.

Colour version (based on the heraldic description):



Note:

The Weyderthof near Larochette, Luxembourg, which still exists today, was already known under that name in 1384. The Weydert crest appears in documents of several family members who held official positions, like Jean-Richard Weydert, councillor of the town of Diekirch, Luxembourg from 1713 to 1725.
